## GOT SNOW?

Please read the following city ordinances pertaining to snow removal and parking regulations within the city of Norway.

**Chapter 69.11 – Parking;** No person shall park, abandon, or leave unattended any vehicle on any public street or City-owned off-street parking area during snow removal operations unless the snow has been removed or plowed from said street, alley, or parking area and the snow has ceased to fall. When any vehicle is left parked for more than 24 hours after a snowfall and the vehicle has been plowed around, a phone call shall be placed

to the last known registered owner in an attempt to have the vehicle removed before it is towed. If the vehicle is not removed 24 hours after contact is made or attempted to be made, the vehicle may be towed.

## DUMPING OF SNOW

*Chapter 135.12 – Dumping of Snow; It is unlawful for any person to throw, push, or place or cause to be thrown, pushed, or placed any ice or snow from private property, sidewalks, or driveways onto the traveled way of a street or alley so as to obstruct gutters, or impede the passage of vehicles upon the street or alley or to create a hazardous condition therein; except where, in the cleaning of large commercial drives in the business district it is absolutely necessary to move the snow onto the street or alley temporarily, such accumulation shall be removed promptly by the property owner.*







# REMOVAL OF SNOW, ICE, AND ACCUMULATIONS

*Chapter 136.03*

*Resolution 22-02*

The abutting property owner shall remove snow, ice, and accumulations promptly from sidewalks. If a property owner does not remove snow, ice, or accumulations within 24 hours after deposit of accumulation, the City may do so and assess the costs against the property owner for collection in the same manner as a property tax. The abutting property owner may be liable for damages caused by failure to remove snow, ice, and accumulations promptly from the sidewalk.

The city council of Norway has adopted a traffic control plan to facilitate snow plowing/removal during snow removal winter months that requires all obstacles and motor vehicles, trailers, wagons, and dumpsters to park on the opposite side of the street every other day after a snowfall of one inch or more has occurred within the last 12-hour period or has been predicted to occur within the next 12-hour period. Alternate side parking restrictions shall require all motor vehicles, trailers,

wagons, dumpsters, and all other obstacles to snow plowing vehicles, to park on the even numbered side of any public roadway on even numbered days and on the odd side of any public roadway on odd numbered days during snow removal.
